

New Year's Tips for Recent Graduates: Set SMART Job Search Goals

At this time of year, unemployed recent graduates are having to come to grips with the fact that their post-graduate permanent job search is a marathon, not a sprint. After 7+ months of looking for employment, many newly minted JDs risk becoming frustrated to the point of paralysis. Even when recent graduates have focused their job search and defined a goal as concrete as “working as a litigation associate in a small firm in New York City,” the process and path to achieving that goal can seem overwhelming and prevent graduates from doing anything after months of searching unsuccessfully.
